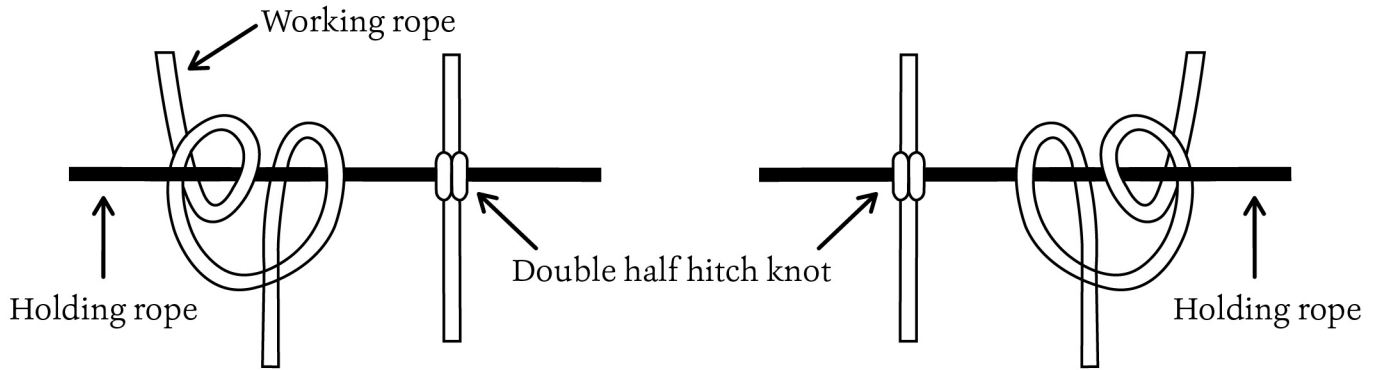
MAKE YOUR OWN MACRAME OWL INSTRUCTIONS

Contents:

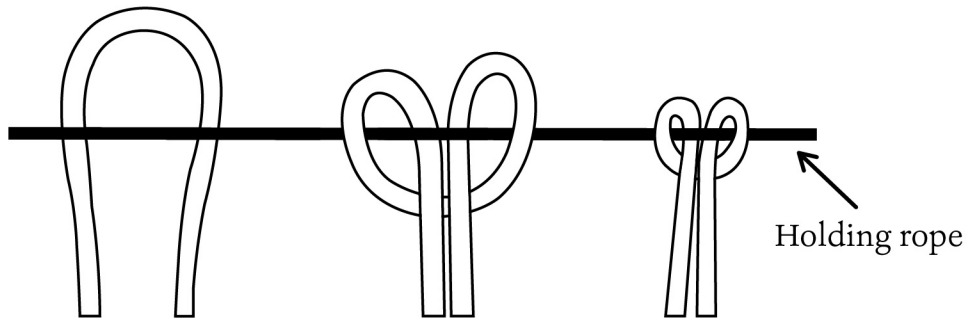
- Cotton rope (100m) x1
- Metal ring (diameter 15 cm) x1
- Wooden ring x2
- Wooden eyes x2
- Wooden nose x1
- Wooden Stick x1



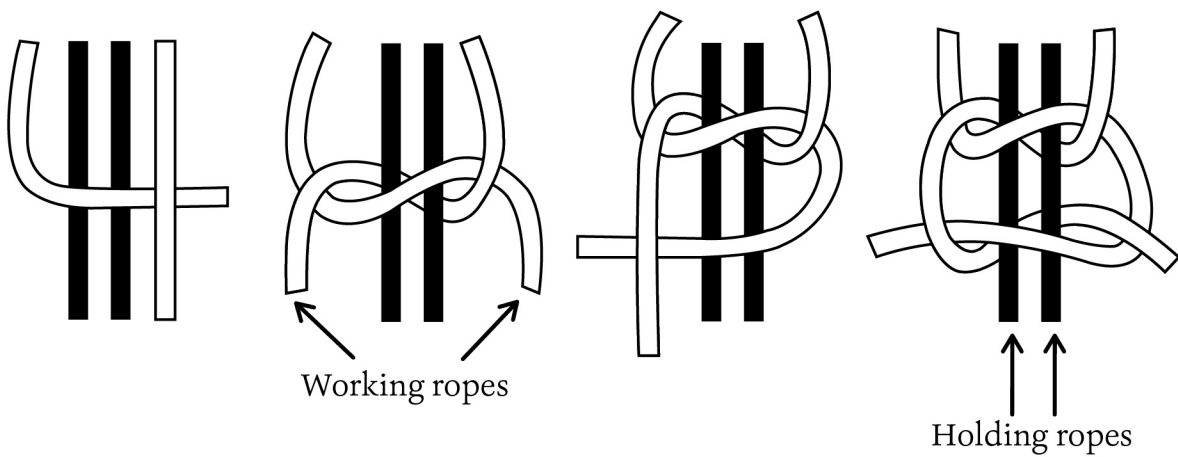
DOUBLE HALF HITCH KNOT (DHH)



REVERSE LARKS HEAD KNOT

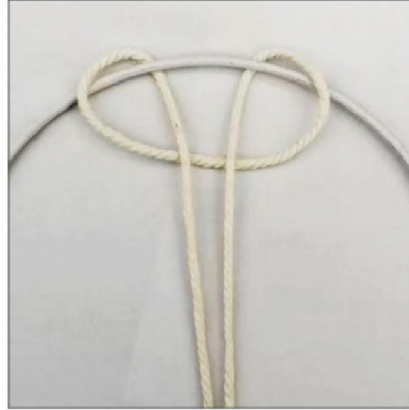
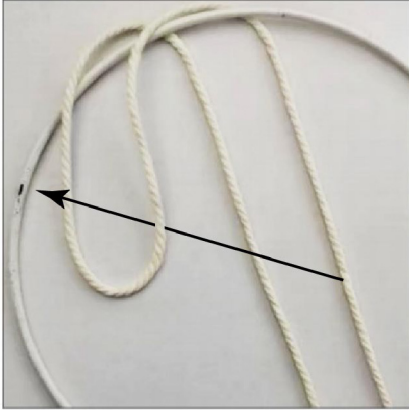


SQUARE KNOT



1. Cut 20 x 300cm and 6 x 130cm cotton rope strands.

2. Attach 10 of the rope strands (300cm folded in half) to the metal ring with a reverse larks head knot (see below).



3. Using the first rope strand only, attach three more rope strands (300cm) with reverse larks head knot.



4. Use the first rope (far left) as a holding rope, tie 6 double half hitch knots (as shown below) along each strand of rope.



5. Attach the holding rope to the metal ring using a double half hitch knot.



6. As above, use the first rope (far left) as the holding rope and tie 5 double half hitch knots and secure to the loop. Repeat this step again with 4, 3, 2 and 1 rows of double half hitched knots so you make a triangle shape like below.



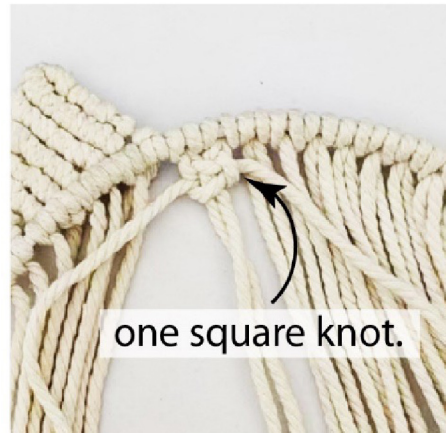
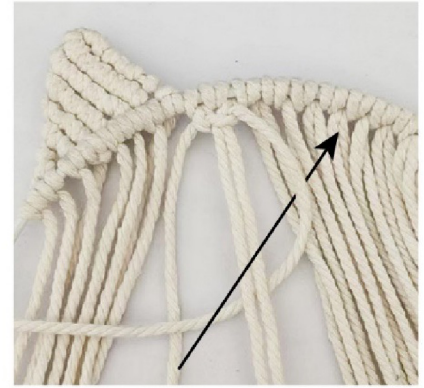
7. Secure the remaining rope to the ring using the double half hitch knot.



8. On the other side, repeat steps 3 - 7 for the other ear.



9. Tie a square knot use ropes 9-12 as seen below.



Repeat this step on ropes 13 - 16, 17 - 20 and 21 - 24. This will be your first row of square knots.



For the second row of square knots tie ropes 11 - 14, 15- 18 and 19 - 22 together.
Repeat for row three using ropes 13 - 16 and 17 - 20.
Repeat for row four using ropes 15 - 18.



10. Tie 4 square knots on ropes 12-18 across and roll it up, securing with a knot underneath.



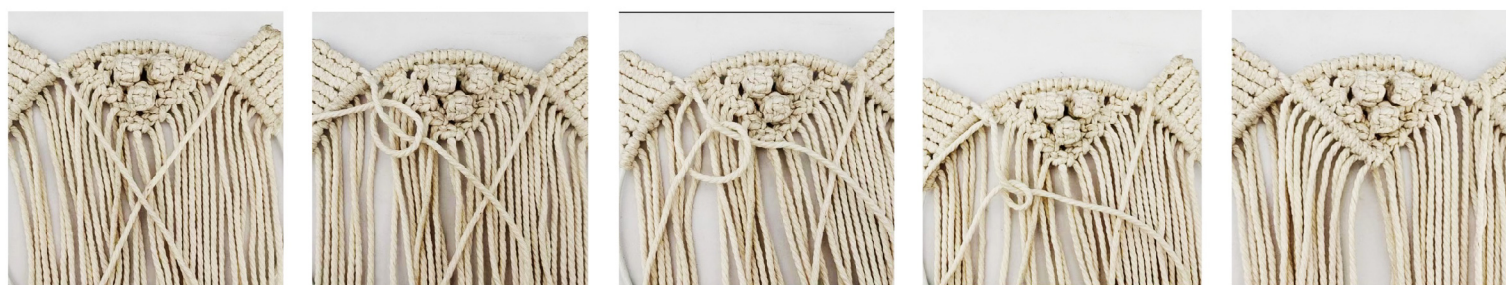
11. Tie 4 square knots on ropes 15-18 across and roll it up, securing with a knot underneath.



12. Make rope 8 a holding rope and tie a diagonal row of DHH knots using working ropes 1-16.



13. Make rope 25 a holding rope and tie a diagonal row of DHH using working ropes 24-16.



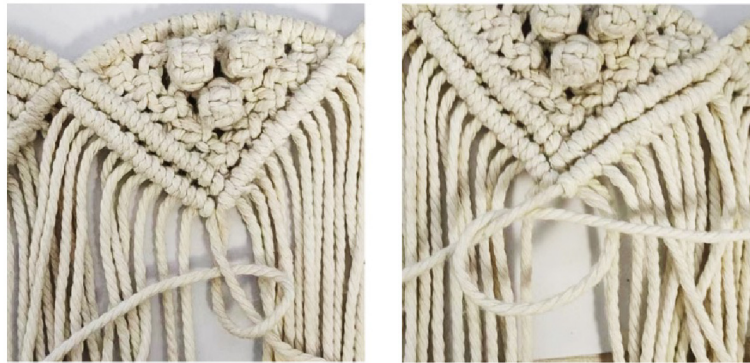
14. Make rope 8 a holding rope and tie DHH knots using working ropes 8-1.



15. Make rope 25 a holding rope and tie DHH knots with working ropes 26 -32.



16. Make rope 8 a holding rope and tie a diagonal row of DHH using ropes 9-16. Repeat on other side, making cord 25 a holding rope and tie row of DHH using ropes 24-17.



17. Tie a row of square knots down each diagonal side and then a row underneath each ear.



18. Thread the eye beads onto ropes 7-8 and 25-26. Thread the nose bead on ropes 17-18. Tie square knots under the beads on ropes 6 - 9 and 24 - 27. Then tie square knots below on ropes 7-10, 11-14, 19 - 22 and 23-26. Then tie the next row of square knots as below on ropes 9-12, 13-16, 17-20 and 21-24.



20. Tie 4 square knots on rows 7-10, 11-14, 15-18, 19-22, 23-26 and 27-30. Roll these 6 rows up.



21. Tie 4 square knots on rows 9-12, 13-16, 17-20, 21-24 and 25-28. Roll these 5 rows up.



22. Repeat steps 20 and 21. Then reduce the rows of square knots to 4, then 3 and then 2. The yarn should now be touching the bottom of the metal hoop.



23. This next part is to make the wings. Make rope 6 a fixed rope. Lay it horizontally and tie a DHH knot with working ropes 5-1. The last knot should be tied around the metal hoop.



24. Take two 160cm long ropes, fold them in half and attach them to the first rope with a reverse lark knot. Take the ends of these knots and DHH knots on the left and right.



25. Take a 160cm long rope and fold in half. Attach this where shown on the photograph. Lay it diagonally down and tie DHH knots using 9-1 as the working ropes (as seen below).



26. Repeat step 25 five times so it looks like below image.



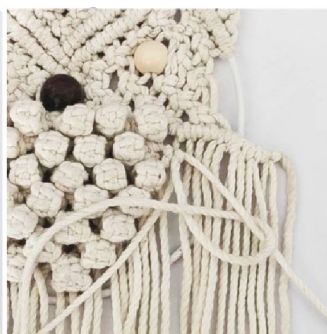
27. Make ropes 9 and 10 holding ropes and tie the DHH knot to working rope 8. Then make ropes 8-10 the holding ropes and tie the DHH knot to rope 7. Keep doing this and adding an holding rope on until all the ropes are tied together.



28. On the front four ropes of the section just made, tie four square knots down.



29. Repeat steps 23 to 28 in mirror image for the other side of the owl.





30. Place the wooden stick between the row of square knots and the excess rope. Use a separate piece of rope and tie it around all the hanging rope a couple of times (like below) and secure with a knot.



31. To finish the eyes cut 28 pieces of 15cm cotton rope and attach 14 pieces to each ring using a reverse lark heads knot. Then comb and trim the string so it's all even and looking circular. Tie the rings to the eyes using an extra rope. Attach the rope to the back of the wooden hoops and pull through the back of the owls body and tie.



32. Trim the hanging tail so it's even.

33. You're done - hang up your new macrame owl!
